Official Information Act request, reference: HNZ3293 – Nurses and Health Care Assistants

1. Total number of Health Care Assistants (HCAs) who have left Te Whatu Ora Waitematā since 1 October 2021.

The total number of HCAs who left Waitematā health district since 1 October 2021 is 90, out of a workforce of approximately 520. Of these, seven left because of the COVID-19 amendment order.

2. Total number of Registered (RN) and Enrolled Nurses (EN), working for Te Whatu Ora Waitematā whose employment contract was terminated under the COVID-19 Public Health Response Vaccinations Amendment Order 2021 (No. 3).

The total number of nurses, including casuals, whose contracts were terminated due to the amendment order from 1 October 2021 until 29 August 2022, was 22. Nursing staff make up the largest proportion of our workforce, with a total of approximately 3,350 by headcount.

3. The current number of Registered Nurse and Enrolled Nurse job vacancies at Waitematā.
