Re: Official Information Act request - Mental health staff and service data

Thank you for your Official Information Act request received by Waitematā District Health Board (DHB) on 14 August 2019, with further clarification received on 22 August 2019, seeking information about mental health staffing in DHBs and indicating this information is being sought across the region.

Before responding to your specific questions, it may be useful to provide some context about our services to assist your understanding. Waitematā DHB serves a population of more than 630,000 people. Our Specialist Mental Health and Addiction Services (SMH&AS) has over 1300 staff and is the largest of this kind in the country, by volume of service-users seen. The speciality comprises Adult Mental Health Services, Child Youth and Family Mental Health Services, Takanga a Fohe (Pacific mental health and addictions), Whitiki Maurea (Kāupapa Māori mental health and addictions), the Regional Forensic Psychiatry Service (covering Northland and greater Auckland regions) and Community Alcohol and Drug Services (CADS). All of our addictions services cover the Auckland region. Mental Health Services for Older Adults sits within Waitematā DHB's Speciality Medicine and Health of Older People Division.

We have endeavoured to show how we have interpreted your request in our answers below. We note that you have told us that you are defining "unit" as each specific work area. For example, Forensics, He Puna Waiora, Waiatarau, Marinoto North, Marinoto West, Adult community acute team north, west, Rodney; CADS by specialty; Whitiki Maurea by specialty; Pacific Mental Health and Addictions by specialty; and C&Y by specialty.

1. Current vacancies by unit and position (Registered Nurse (RN), Mental Health Assistant (MHA), Allied)

Any large service with over 1300 staff will, at any given time, have some vacancies while appropriately qualified staff are recruited due to normal workforce turnover. We aim to minimise appointment timeframes wherever possible so as to ensure best care for our patients and also to ensure our staff are properly supported in their work. It should be noted that there are difficulties with recruiting mental health and addiction staff nationally.

The table below shows vacancies by unit and position. Allied health incorporates the following designated roles: community support workers, cultural workers, occupational therapists,

psychologists, social workers and youth workers. Health Care Assistants (HCA) is the term used rather than MHA. Please note that our community teams are inclusive of acute components.

You will note a range of vacancies across our services. In addition to the usual turnover in positions and some lag in filling the consequent vacancies, some of the vacancies are a result of newly funded roles to which recruitment has not been completed. In Adult Services, recruitment is in progress for

additional FTE which has been funded to support the unit's capacity to flex up and down total bed numbers as required to meet demand. This includes new positions including 5.5 FTE Registered Nurses in He Puna Wairoa and a 1 FTE Bed Coordinator.

At Forensics, a change in the service-delivery model to build our capacity to respond to Māori patients has led to a re-organisation of staff and left some areas with vacancies. Some of the vacancies require specific experience and skills which can be difficult to recruit to. Also, at Forensics we are exploring options to fill vacancies in areas which are difficult to recruit to. This could include short-term secondments or introducing senior nurse roles. Additionally, recruitment is in progress for additional FTE which have recently been funded to manage the acuity of specifically identified patients within the intellectual disability unit.

2. Current skills mix by unit by years of experience of current staff

We are not readily able to provide information on the experience of current staff as this is held in individual personnel files and a significant resource would be required to collate this data, taking at least several weeks.

Therefore, we have determined to withhold this data under section 18(f) of the Official Information Act due to significant collation on research. We have considered extending the timeframe for response and charging for the staff time required to collate this information but do not believe this would assist in managing such a large request. 3. Current allocated FTE by unit and position, allocated FTE by unit and position 2 years ago, and allocated FTE by unit and position 5 years ago

The table below shows allocated FTE by unit and position. Please note that the Adult Services community "by unit" figures between August 2014 and August 2017 are not comparable as the service was restructured and the staff cannot be mapped back to departments that previously did not exist. You will note that there has been a reduction in FTE in our Pacific addiction services due to a restructure of the service. You will also note an increase in Forensics FTE, which is related to opening a new 15-bed unit, and an increase in General Management FTE which is mainly related to re-establishing of Quality Team positions. There has also been growth in the child and adolescent services with the development of a Rodney-based team in line with population growth and the development of an infant mental health service for the whole district in response to the 2012 "Healthy Beginnings" framework from the Ministry of Health.

5. Current Health of the Nation Scale (HoNOS) by unit (measuring previous 12 months)

The table below shows average HoNOS scores by unit for the 12 months ending July 2019. This has been calculated as an average of the total HoNOS scores for each unit from admission, review and discharge HoNOS collections. The HoNOS is a clinician-rated tool developed by the United Kingdom Royal College of Psychiatrists' Research Unit to measure the health and social functioning of people

experiencing severe mental illness, using a 12-item scale. HoNOS is the nationally mandated outcome measure for mental health care. Please note that addictions services do not use HoNOS.
